	Grant - There was a meeting with NHDC re the PACIF grant of £50,000.	
4	Reports	
	Treasurer - SS handed round the Profit and Loss account and said we are still in the black to the tune of £3,732.26 and there is still money to come from the Boxing Day Fun Run.	
	The Savings Account is £9,950; Contingency Fund £1,193; MUGA account £7,453.	
	SS has had some correspondence with Dill Wetherall re the Boxing Day Fun Run and he will give us £200 towards the cost. SS bought plastic carpet protectors and £700 was agreed. £330 profit was made which will go towards the new Pavilion.	

DS was asked if the Cricket Club would contribute but there has not been a DS meeting as yet. Expenditure is in line with last year but heat and lighting will be 50% higher. DS confirmed he will be increasing the bar prices slightly SS wondered if it DS would be worth buying different size wine glasses but DS felt people were more inclined to buy bottles rather than glasses. Bar and Bookings - DS said its ticking over. Theres a Burns Night coming up but this doesn't generate a lot of profit for the Club. There are not many bookings apart from a few weddings. Hire charges cover bar staff and it's a lot easier since we started paying for this. SS confirmed that Lea Sports have a booking for 22 May for their annual awards. Maintenance - Following the break in we have fitted new doors to the store room and the fire exits. One door was fitted internally and all the doors have been painted. New bolts have been put on the fire exits and the push doors. Instructions have been written up for the fire exits. When the club is open the padlocks will need to be taken off and put back on afterwards. The fourth fire door from Steve Kitchener has been stored as its not needed at the present time. A timer has been put on the heater and there is a new heater in the away dressing room which the football club paid for. **Events** Boxing Day Run - This made a profit as already mentioned. We need to think about the carpet in future as, even with the plastic protector, the floor got very messy. The organisers will contribute towards the cost so maybe a tarpaulin at the kitchen end of the bar would be more effective next time. We will also need a couple more volunteers for the kitchen the next time. We really need 3-4 people to make it work. Decided not to do soup next just the mulled wine which was very popular. January - Sharps Hooter are coming on 29th. Need to advertise this more SS so SS will put some notices round the villages. February - Quiz on 26th run by Richard Easterbrook. SSt and RM will SSt/RM organise the food and it was agreed to do chilli and bread. SSt cannot be there on the night but will make a pan of chilli and ask Vicky Gentle if she can SSt help on the night and maybe make some chilli as well. SS estimated roughly 75 on past numbers for the quiz but will keep RM updated and also put a SS deadline on the notices. March - Karaoke on 26th. SS knows someone who can organise this and SS provide the equipment.



	OL said that the Tennis Club would like to have some sort of covered area over at the MUGA where they could make a hot drink. A wooden hut probably wouldn't be the answer as it would be vandalised but something like a secure concrete structure which could be built onto the Stand might be a good idea. There could be an area outside with seating to watch the tennis. Obviously a power and water supply would be necessary but this could be done by a working party over a period of time rather than all done at once.	

Agreed this was a good idea and would be acceptable to the committee. DS said it could also be used as a storage facility for the tennis club as the nets could be kept in there. SS said there he thought someone in the Football Club was an electrician who might be able to help with the electrics. We also need up-to-date test certificates so he may be able to help with this.

SS said that the roof on the Stand isn't very good and will need to be renewed so this could all be done at the same time.

OL brought up the re-surfacing of the MUGA which was scheduled to be done in the next two years. He asked if it really did need re-surfacing as it seemed in reasonable condition. SS agreed and said that we will be guided by the man who comes to clean it. It will, therefore, be done as and when its necessary.
