ACTION **Apologies** Rosemary Manders 2 **Minutes of the Previous Meetings** The minutes of the previous meeting were agreed and signed. **Matters Arising** Wine measures had been purchased and the noticeboard updated. A new cupboard had been installed in the storeroom. The electricians had checked the water heater and found no fault. DS had collected a new fridge from Hazel Davies, which is now installed. Bar and Bookings - DS reported that there were no bookings in the foreseeable future, apart from AS on New Year's Eve and a Youth Club party. Arrangements for the Boxing Day Run are well in hand. (Ds will provide a float DS for the kitchen, run by SS). Maintenance One of the wooden posts at the end of the car park had been broken off by vandals and thrown into Phil Cook's field. The post had been rotten and an inspection has shown that many others are in a similar condition, many with strimmer damage. It was agreed to replace the posts at the far end of the lefthand arm of the car park and then consider ways to fund a complete replacement of the other 25 posts in the coming years. The wallpaper still needs to be replaced & painted where the old wall heaters SS were and the new door needs painting inside.
